### Introduction

Lifewater works with indigenous teams and partners on the ground in developing nations so that we can get water purification kits to people in need as quickly and cost effectively as possible.



### Mission report

On Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> October 2011, Roger and Glenys London, UK Lifewater representatives living and working in Uganda, travelled by bus to Nabinoola trading centre before boarding Pastor Caleb Kabaho's 4x4 Suzuki to travel the final hour into the bush along deeply rutted and slippery dirt tracks. A shorter route was avoided to Katoma because of the previous night's heavy rains making driving down the dirt track very difficult.

The half built country church in Katoma was the venue for the afternoon meeting, bringing together headmasters, school teachers, doctors, nurses, pastors, local councilors and a belated policeman to hear about Lifewater and the kits that had been sponsored through the 'See the Difference - <http://www.seethedifference.org/charities/lifewater/give-clean-water> website. The rest of the audience was made up, as always, with children and inquisitive mothers from the village. Through translation, Roger spoke about Lifewater and then demonstrated how the Lifewater systems were assembled using the kits and the locally-sourced 60 litre buckets. Then the various recipients of the 14 kits were all encouraged to try their own hand at assembling the kits, closely monitored by Roger and Pastor Caleb. All of the recipients were overjoyed to receive the Lifewater systems which will make a huge difference to a small rural spot in Uganda, which is very unlikely to see safe piped drinking water. The following morning was spent visiting several of the local institutions, which had been recipients of the Lifewater systems the day before.
